

Scholastic REDAligns to Title II, Part A

The purpose of *Title II*, *Part A* is to increase the academic achievement of all students by helping schools and districts improve teacher and principal quality and ensure that all teachers are highly qualified. The program offers a Local Education Agency (LEA) the flexibility to design and implement a wide variety of activities that can promote a teaching staff that is highly qualified and able to help all students—regardless of individual learning needs—achieve challenging State content and academic achievement standards. According to the federal guidance for *Improving Teacher Quality State Grants*, an LEA's local plan must include activities that address several key areas. The following chart provides an overview of how *Scholastic RED* can help an LEA carry out activities for each required area.

Conduct a local needs assessment and report the results. 2. 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The RED results-based instructional model includes:

- Interactive Online Training—RED online courses provide video modeling of best practices, interactive simulations, teacher and student resources, feedback, and ongoing support. The online courses meet teachers' needs by providing high-quality professional development that respects time demands.
- Onsite Study Groups—Whether led by a district facilitator trained by Scholastic or by a Scholastic consultant, the learning continues in onsite study groups where educators collaborate with peers, reflect on learning topics, analyze student work, and watch modeled course strategy demonstrations.
- Focused Classroom Applications—From lesson plans, to classroom strategies and teacher resources to management tools, RED provides everything teachers need to make an immediate impact on student learning.

Scholastic RED graduate-level online courses help teachers continue their professional development with a balance of online and in-person learning, peer discussion, and individual study. RED courses provide targeted training on research-based strategies for instruction, assessment, and differentiation to increase student achievement.

- 3. Provide activities that are based on:
- A review of scientifically based research
- Have a substantial, measurable, and positive impact on student academic achievement
- A broader strategy to eliminate the achievement gap between low-income and minority students from other students

The Scholastic RED Professional Development Theory of Change specifies a set of causal relationships that link the activities in which teachers participate to a set of results. It articulates in specific, directional steps how this program—which is a teaching and learning improvement intervention—produces anticipated changes in schools and districts and in teacher and student behaviors or outcomes. The theory specifies the process through which introducing the RED professional development program changes the school and district instructional environment, affects teachers' classroom practice, and improves student learning.

- The delivery model incorporates elements from adult learning theory, principles of effective professional development, and empirical research on professional development.
- The content of the program reflects research on professional development and on reading instruction. Both of these emphasize the importance of giving teachers appropriate content knowledge and researchbase instructional strategies.

5.Ensure that the professional development needs of teachers (including teacher mentoring) and principals will be met	The RED Implementation Services provides comprehensive implementation services in conjunction with RED online course to improve teacher practice and raise student achievement. This optional service provides educators with the tools, processes, and support that translate into solid results. The optional Implementation and Evaluation Services package includes: A dedicated Implementation Manager manages each implementation beginning with a comprehensive needs assessment and ending with the presentation of a summative report.
	 The Summative Implementation Report includes a presentation of an evaluation, which shows the impact RED has had on teaching and learning using pre- and post-test data and surveys from teachers and facilitators. Reports include quantitative and qualitative data, course completion figures, and recommendations for the next RED implementation. Online Learner Progress and Assessment Reports provide essential evaluation tools to manage and evaluate the district's RED implementation, including the resources to manage and track teachers' course progress and the data to determine the impact of RED on teacher content knowledge, instructional practice, and confidence in the instruction of reading. RED will create a Customized Professional Development Web Site for the district. The Web site is an important
	communication mechanism to ensure that teachers, literacy coaches, and principals have the most up-to-date news, information, and tools to stay connected, engaged, and updated on the district's RED implementation.

The RED toolkit within the course allows district leaders to deliver customized messages, information, and resources that only teachers in the district can see. Integrate <i>Title II, Part A</i> funds with funds the LEA receives through the <i>Enhancing Education through Technology</i> program (<i>Title II, Part D</i>) to train teachers to integrate technology into curricula and instruction to improve teaching, learning, and technology literacy.	RED effectively integrates technology to deliver a high-quality professional development solution for districts. RED blends online learning with customized on-site workshops and coaching for teachers, staff developers, and principals. The facilitated online courses cover research-based content and strategies; utilize modeling and presentations by skilled practitioners; and allow for practice in a controlled risk-free environment. RED professional development qualifies for funding from the <i>Enhancing Education Through Technology</i> program and RED-supported activities can easily be coordinated and aligned to improve teaching and learning.
7. Collaborate with teachers, paraprofessionals, principals, and other relevant school personnel, and parents in preparing the local plan and the activities to be undertaken.	The RED model is centered on a collaborative partnership with districts. The RED team works with districts to identify activities and customize a plan for implementing continuous professional development. Annual planning meetings are recommended to assess yearly progress and recalibrate the plan to address special requirements. Through regular collaborative planning with RED, districts can achieve long-term positive effects on teacher practice and student achievement.

- Improve student behavior in the classroom
- Involve parents in their child's education
