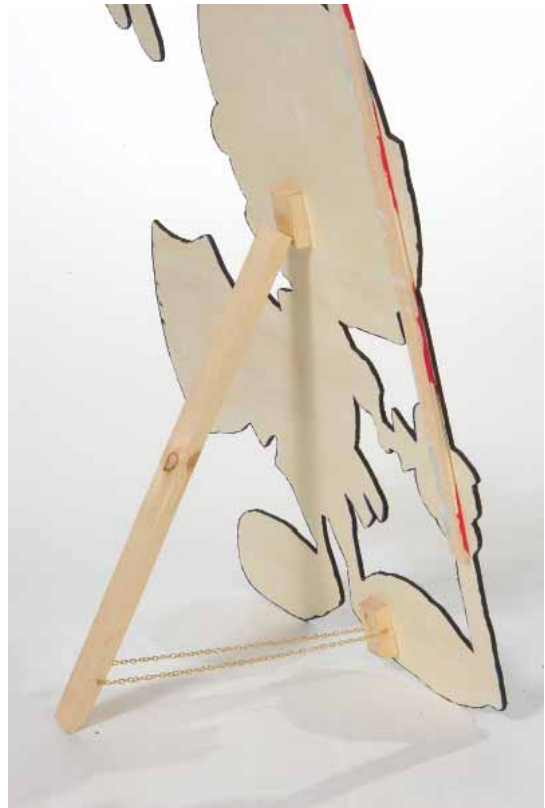
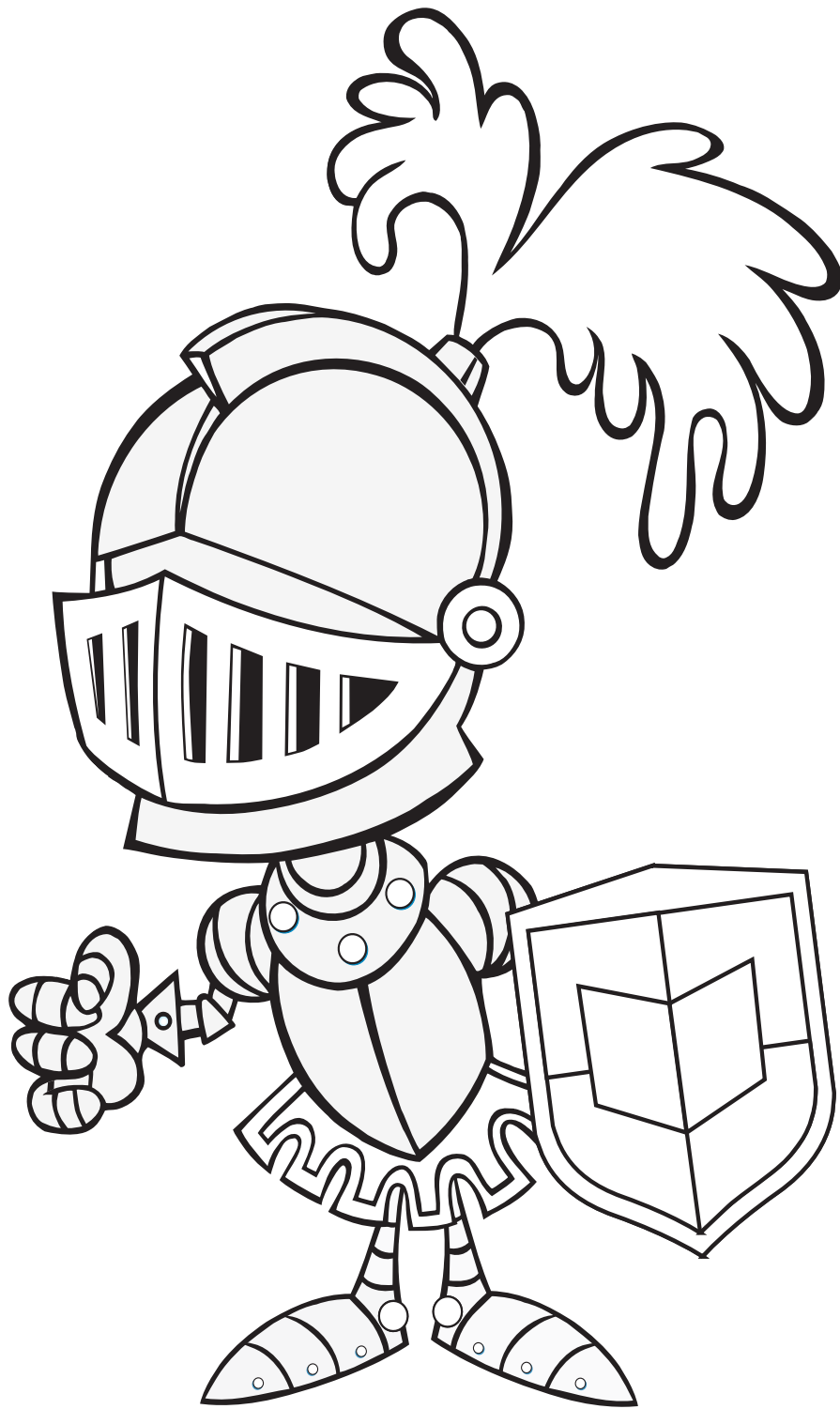

Knight

Materials for One Knight

1 sheet of plywood (48 in. x 24½ in., ¼ in. thick) or 1 sheet thick cardboard (48 in. x 36 in.)
white paint
24 in. of wood strips (1½ in. wide, ¾ in. thick)
26 in. of light weight chain
various colors of tempera paint
paintbrushes
chalk
48½ in. PVC pipe
red construction paper
yellow construction paper
hot glue gun and glue sticks
pen or pencil

1. Enlarge knight to desired size and trace pattern onto wood/thick cardboard and cut out.
2. Paint knight using tempera paint (per supplied photo), or paint as you wish.
3. Make pole from PVC pipe and wrap with red construction paper stripes.
4. Hot glue pole or tape pole to back of knight so it shows behind his hand.
5. Cut fleur-de-lis out of yellow construction paper. Draw details with brown or gold chalk.
Hot glue to top of pole.
6. Hang banner from pole.

Note: Knights may be made from paper and taped to a wall. For knights made from paper or cardboard, use paper banners rather than cloth, so knights aren't too heavy. (For knights made from wood, see picture for guideline on making easels. For knights made from cardboard, use a right triangle as an easel.)
