# Towers

## Materials for One Tower

corrugated paper (thinner and more flexible than brown corrugated boxes, usually comes in a roll, available at art supply or craft stores)

\*For the smaller towers, the corrugate is approximately 45 in. x 72 in.

\*For the larger towers, the corrugate is approximately 60 in. x 108 in.

2 sheets of foam core (32 in. x 40 in.)

scissors

duct tape

double-sided tape

glue


2 - 4 sheets of purple construction paper

30 in. yellow bulletin board trim (buy precut or design your own)

utility knife

2 - 4 rolls of blue bulletin board paper, depending on size of tower

2 - 4 rolls of blue wrapping paper that will contrast with blue background of tower

1. For the bigger tower, use a utility knife to cut a turret  design out of the top of a piece of corrugate.
2. Cut out window using a utility knife.
3. Gently bend the corrugate so it forms a semi-circle.
4. Cut two pieces of foam core into semi-circles that have the same diameter as the tower (Smaller tower only needs one).
5. Duct tape one semi-circle to the inside bottom of the tower and duct tape the other one to the middle. (If you need to stabilize the tower more, attach a piece of wood to the bottom semi-circle.)
6. Cover tower with bulletin board paper. Tuck extra to back and tape down with duct tape.
7. Cut stones out of a darker colored wrapping paper. The stones should vary in shape and size. Attach to tower using double-sided tape. Curling in on edge is good as it imitates stone.
8. Cut strips of purple paper or bulletin board trim and glue pieces around tower window.
