



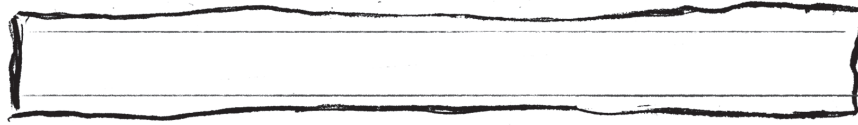
Hilde Cracks the Case
