

Enlarging grid patterns is so easy that children can do it. Each side of a square equals one inch.

- Enlarge the easiest patterns directly onto a large sheet of any paper. Using a measuring tape, measure and mark all corner points of the pattern on the paper. Then draw the full-size pattern by connecting the points with lines as shown.
- To enlarge a pattern with more details, use a cardboard cutting board with a grid printed on it. Tape a sheet of tracing paper to the full-size grid by marking all corners and then connecting them with lines as shown. Or use a one-inch grid paper.

Hat & Beard

Sewing directions

Hat: Stitch side seam of each layer separately. Turn one hat right side out and pull it over the other. Topstitch the rims together. For a chinstrap, cut a tiny hole at each side near lower edge, push elastic through holes, and knot securely. To make a pompom, cut a ten-inch square of Polarfleece. Cut two opposite edges into a narrow fringe along the stretchy cross-grain and pull to curl the ends. Roll the uncut center tightly and tie with a fabric strip. Hotglue or hand sew to hat tip.

Hair and beard from Polarfleece: Cut one long edge into a fringe and pull into curls. Hotglue the uncut edge under hat rim for hair. Make beard to match hair. For a strap behind ears, attach elastic (see hat).
