# MAKING TIME FOR SCIENCE AND SOCIAL STUDIES

### 1. TEACH SCIENCE AND SOCIAL STUDIES UNITS SEPARATELY

Teaching units separately provides students with the opportunity to dive deeper into each subject.

#### 2. TEACH THEMATIC UNITS

Incorporate science/ social studies content into reader's and writer's workshops.

### 3. TEACH SCIENCE/SOCIAL STUDIES IN LIEU OF WRITER'S WORKSHOP

If possible, take one or two days each week to teach science or social studies during writing time.

### 4. CHOOSE SCIENCE AND SOCIAL STUDIES TEXTS FOR GUIDED READING GROUPS

Strategically pick science and social studies texts that align with your current unit of study.

## 5. MAKE SCIENCE AND SOCIAL STUDIES TEXTS AVAILABLE AND ACCESSIBLE IN YOUR CLASSROOM LIBRARY

Have "thematic unit" book bins accessible for students during independent reading time.

#### 6. HOME PROJECTS

Science and social studies take-home projects promote further discovery for students.

#### 7. COLLABORATE WITH SCHOOL SCIENCE TEACHER

Provide students with science content whenever and wherever possible.
