













# SAFETY HAZARDS GAME CARDS

Make multiple copies of this sheet and cut out enough cards so each student gets three to five. Follow instructions in Step 4 of the lesson to play.



 <b>ENERGY HAZARD</b>	<p>A “rotten egg” smell</p>	 <b>ENERGY SAFETY TIP</b>	<p>It could be a gas leak. Tell an adult, go outside, and call 911.</p>
 <b>ENERGY HAZARD</b>	<p>A fallen power line outside</p>	 <b>ENERGY SAFETY TIP</b>	<p>Stay far away from a fallen power line. Tell an adult and call 911.</p>
 <b>ENERGY HAZARD</b>	<p>Charging a phone near the sink</p>	 <b>ENERGY SAFETY TIP</b>	<p>Charge devices away from sinks and water.</p>
 <b>ENERGY HAZARD</b>	<p>Tugging on the cord to unplug an appliance</p>	 <b>ENERGY SAFETY TIP</b>	<p>Always pull by the plug, not the cord.</p>
 <b>ENERGY HAZARD</b>	<p>Hiding power cords under the rug</p>	 <b>ENERGY SAFETY TIP</b>	<p>Don't cover power cords with rugs, carpets, or furniture.</p>
 <b>ENERGY HAZARD</b>	<p>An outlet feels warm</p>	 <b>ENERGY SAFETY TIP</b>	<p>Tell an adult to shut off the power circuit.</p>
