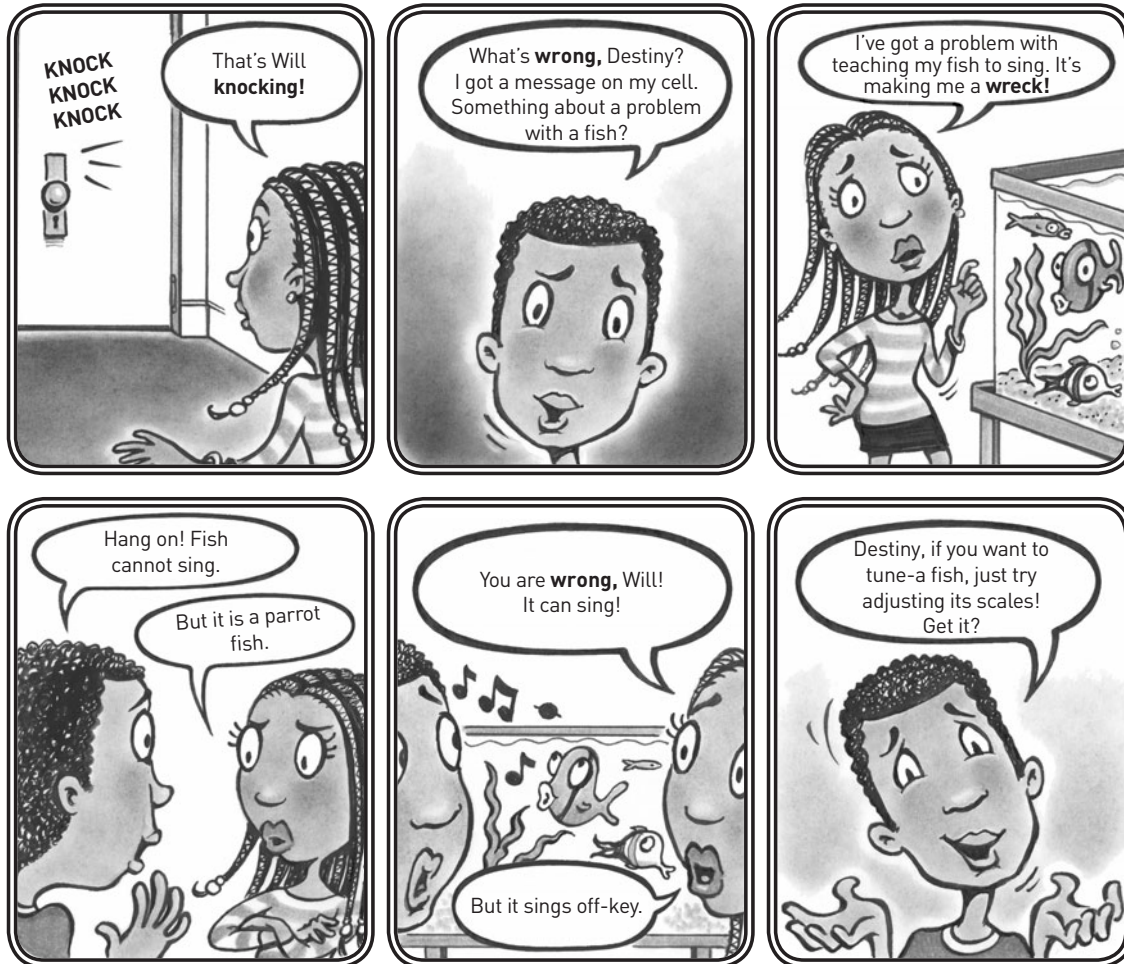

## 2 Finding a Shipwreck

People like things **written** about **shipwrecks** and sunken treasures. After all, a ship that has sunk is like a huge time capsule. It can tell us a lot about the past.

**Shipwrecks** used to be much more common in the past. But ships still sink today. Strong winds, thick fog, raging fires, and other things can make a ship sink.

Sometimes a ship will drift in the **wrong** direction. Then, it can crash or **knock** against a huge rock, ice cap, or other ship. This can make a ship sink as well.

Divers can go inside some **shipwrecks** to study them. They may locate gems and historical objects. But if a **wreck** is a military ship, they cannot take its contents. That stuff must stay with the **wreck**.
