- Personal Interviews** with people can provide first-hand accounts of daily life in a career.
- Electronic Databases** can contain CD-ROM or Web encyclopedias, statistical information, stock photos, and more.
- The Internet** includes Web sites for almost every subject, online versions of print media, and sites for government agencies.
