

Lesson 14**Subject and Object Pronouns**

A **pronoun** is a word that takes the place of a noun.

Subject pronouns, such as *I, you, he, she, it, we,* and *they*, can be the subject of a sentence.

Object pronouns, such as *me, you, him, her, it, us,* and *them*, follow an action verb or words such as *to, with, for,* or *at*.

Underline the action verb. Then circle the object pronoun. Remember, an object pronoun often follows an action verb or words like *to, at, from,* or *with*.
