## Subjects and Verbs

1. Subject: The person, place, thing, or idea that a sentence is about.

2. Verb: Tells what the subject does or is.





# Subject-Verb Agreement



- If the *subject* of a sentence is *plural*, the *verb* must also be *plural*.
- If the *subject* of a sentence is *singular*, the *verb* must also be *singular*.

## **Writing Tip**

- To make a subject plural, you normally add a 's.' (ex. boy/boys, pitcher/pitchers)
- To make a verb
  *plural*, you normally
  *remove the 's.'* (ex.
  plays/play,
  throws/throw)

Subject	Verb
Boys	play
Boy	plays
Pitcher	throws
Pitchers	throw
