Yeah, except of all the rooftops in Brooklyn to escape off, what are the odds we run right into Kid Spider?!

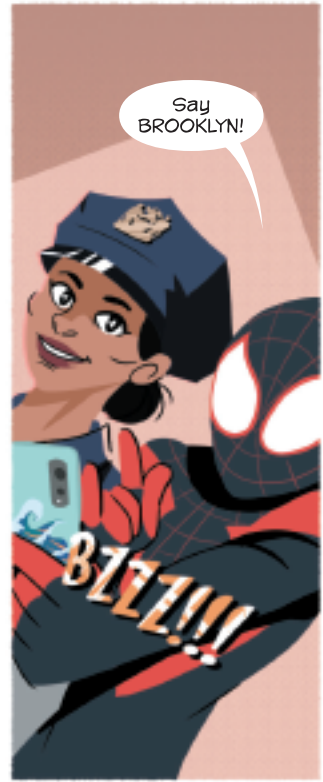


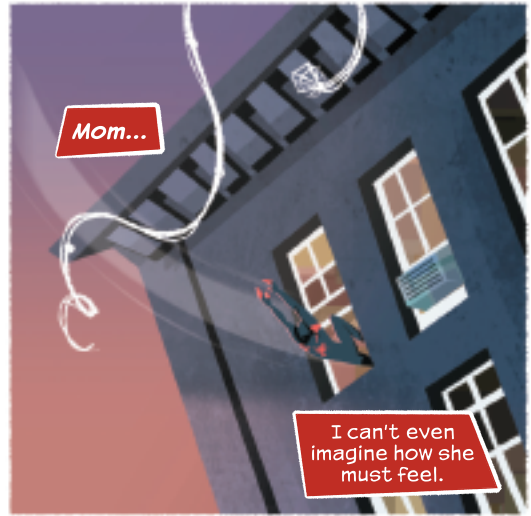

going?

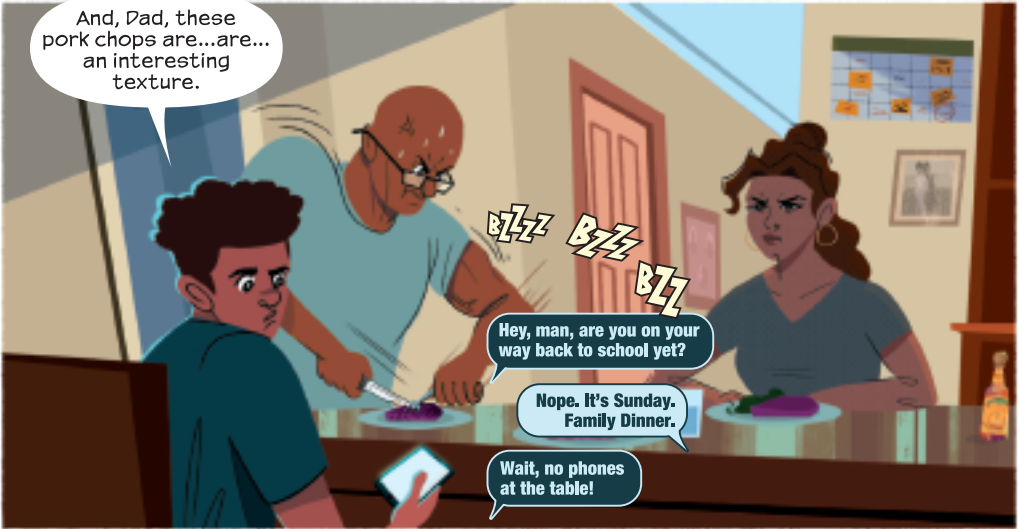
