Components

Take-Home Book

Family Letter

A letter introducing the collection and its goals to families, including activities and prompts

Classroom Books


Four books aligned to each of the five SEL themes (2 copies each for paired reading; 40 books in total)

Book Bins

Containers for organizing the books by SEL theme

SEL Themes

The key ideas explored in this collection are based on five basic social-emotional learning themes.

How to Use the Collection

Take-Home Book

- To begin, read the take-home book together with your class.
- Let children know that they get to keep the book, and that they can read it together with their families.

Family Letter

- Send the family letter home with the take-home book.
- Encourage children to have a family member fill out the prompts on the back of the letter and bring it back in.

Classroom Books

- Use the stickers and book list provided to label each book by theme.
- Organize the books in the bins according to theme.

Suggested Strategies

Each strategy is designed to reinforce multiple SEL themes indicated by the labels below.

Reading Aloud

While each book relates to a specific SEL theme, most can be used to discuss multiple themes. You can also read each book several times, focusing on the thoughts and actions of different characters and different SEL themes.

Paired Reading

Pair two students of different fluency levels to read to one another. The student with the lower fluency level benefits by listening and modeling. The student with the higher fluency level benefits through self-expression and helping someone else. Readers with the same fluency level can also be paired by giving them a story they've already read. This time, they can focus on close reading and comprehension.

Rereading

In order to help students understand feelings from another's point of view, reread the story together and identify key characters. Which character helped someone? Which character created obstacles or caused problems for others? What would you do in the character's shoes?
