Finding the Right Book

The best question a student can ask is, "Can you help me find a book?" And that can also be a scary question. Helping students know which book is right for them means knowing books, because handing the right book to a student can mean turning that student into a reader.

How do we keep up with books for children and teens? Well, first, we read a lot. But how do we know what to read? We begin by asking kids to tell us what they are reading. They love sharing the titles that excite them and that's the best way for us to keep up with popular titles.

Second, we ask other teachers, colleagues, and librarians two questions: 1. What do you suggest we read? and 2. What are you hoping kids will read next? In your school, be sure to keep a visible space for teachers, librarians, and even parents to jot down titles of books that they've found are hits with their students.
