Strategy being monitored:

The student can demonstrate: Application of the strategy with an instructional and/or independent reading text. Recall of details. Understanding of content. How he or she uses context clues to figure out unfamiliar words. The ability to recognize what he or she does and does not understand. Connections to self. Connections to other texts. Connections to family and community. Connections to world problems and issues.
The student's written work illustrates the ability to: Recall details. Explain unfamiliar words using context clues. Make a variety of connections. Use content to infer. Summarize. Synthesize across texts. Support or adjust predictions. Visualize.
