- **4.** Why do you think the poet uses the phrase "fearful symmetry"?
- **5.** What are the denotative and connotative meanings of this phrase? How do the connotative meanings help you understand a theme of the poem?
- **6.** Why does the poet wonder if the creator of the tyger smiled?
- **7.** What does the tyger symbolize? Brainstorm a list of the connotative and denotative meanings of this word.

List the words and phrases that match what the tyger symbolizes in this poem. Discuss your list with your partner and figure out the tone of the poem.
