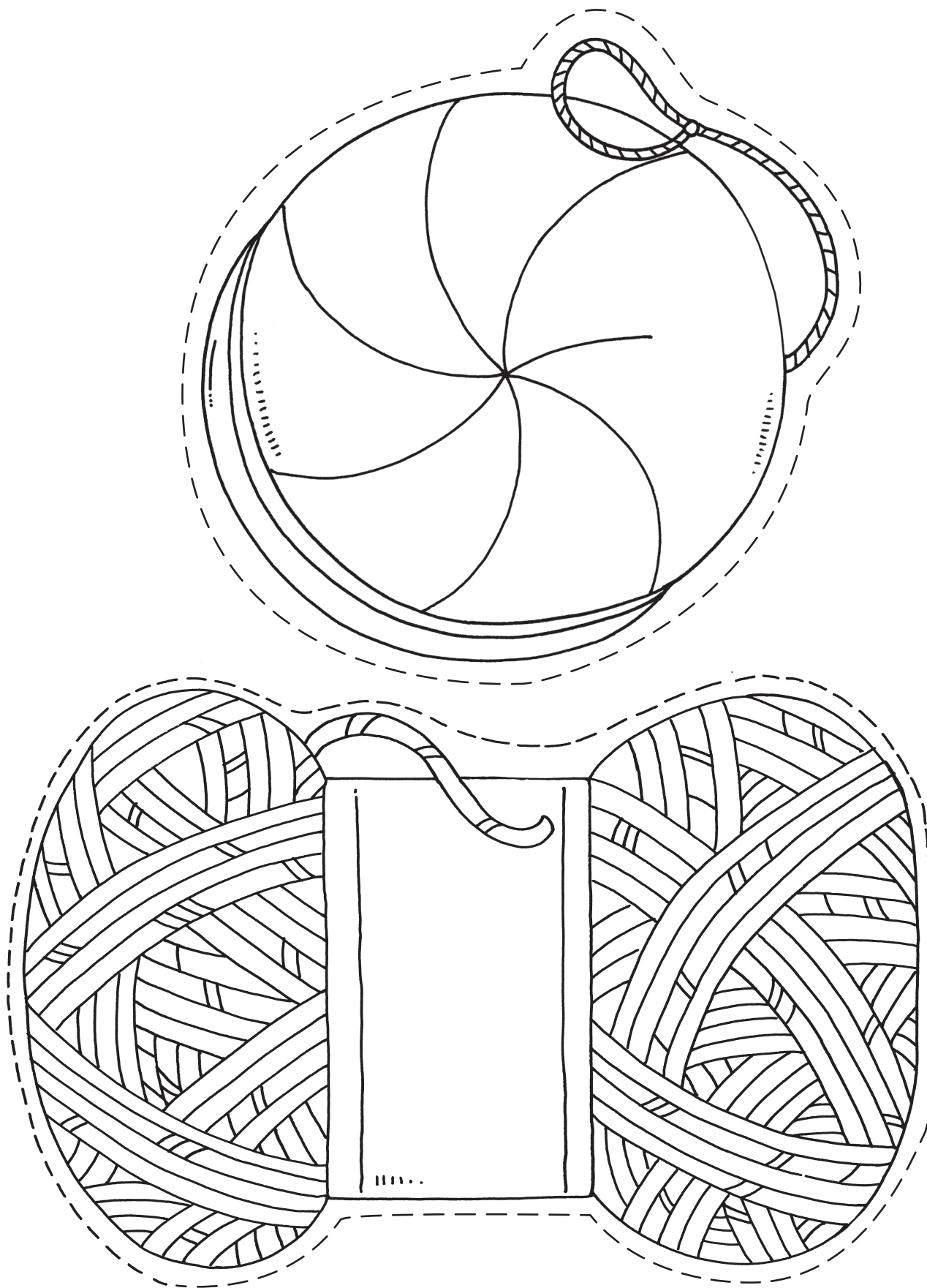


## Picture Patterns

To the Teacher: Copy and cut out the yarn and yo-yo patterns. Use the pictures for instructional activities, center games, and bulletin boards.



To the Teacher: Copy, cut out, and glue the directions to the front of a zipper storage bag, folder, or large envelope. Then make multiple copies of the Letter BINGO Board and cut them out. Also copy and cut apart the letter cards and place them in a small paper bag. Place all of the game materials inside the bag, folder, or envelope along with an ample supply of space markers, such as buttons or counters.

# Letter BINGO

Directions:

Play this game with small groups or the whole class.

1. Have children write a different letter in each space on their BINGO board (for example, favorite letters, letters in their name, letters they know well, letters on the alphabet wall frieze). Tell children to use each letter only once.
2. Give each child an ample supply of space markers. Then draw one letter card at a time and read aloud the letter.
3. If a child's game board contains the letter, he or she places a marker on the space.
4. The first child to get five markers in a row vertically, horizontally, or diagonally calls out "Letter BINGO!" The child then reads aloud the letters in the row as you check them against the letter cards drawn from the bag. If these match, the child wins.

(Variation: Call out the sound the letter represents.)

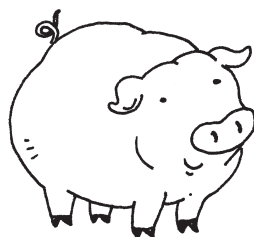

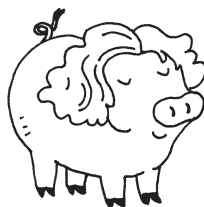

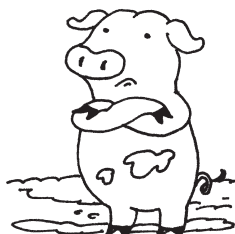
