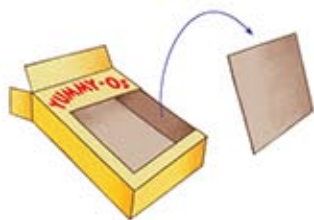




Letter a Door Sign or two or three...

To make a sign strong enough to handle the ins and outs of your hectic life, reinforce it with thin cardboard. Cereal boxes work great for this.

1 Cut a panel from an empty cereal box.



2 Use a glue stick or double-sided tape to cover the panel with construction paper.

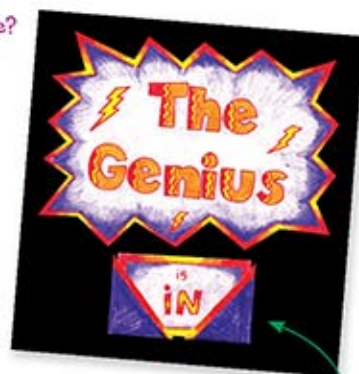


3 Create your lettering on a sheet of plain paper and use a glue stick or double-sided tape to attach it to the construction paper.

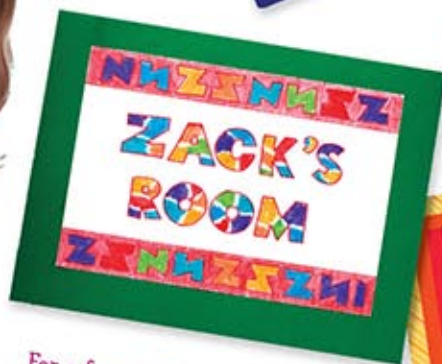


Tape it, tack it or hang it from a knob — stick your sign on your door any way that works for you (and your parents).

Who needs glue? Try cutting letters and shapes out of the sticker paper instead.



To make pockets for an IN/OUT sign, cut the bottom corners off an envelope and glue them to your sign.



For a fancy sign, use wrapping paper or foil in place of construction paper.
