

ABOUT DAV PILKEY

When Dav was a kid, he was diagnosed with ADHD and dyslexia. He was so disruptive in class that his teachers made him sit out in the hallway every day. Luckily, Dav loved to draw and make up stories, so he spent his time in the hallway creating his own original comic books—the very first adventures of Dog Man and Captain Underpants.

Since then, Dav has written and illustrated a number of bestselling and award-winning children's books, including the Caldecott Honor book *The Paperboy*. His Captain Underpants and Dog Man graphic novels have sold millions of copies worldwide and have been translated into many languages.

Launched in 1919, Children's Book Week commemorates its 106th anniversary in 2025. It is the longest-running national literacy initiative in the country. ACTIVITIES FOR COMMUNITY READ PROGRAMMING

The Dog Man series celebrates creativity and imagination and explores universally positive messages including the importance of doing good, empathy, and compassion. Here are some fun Dog Man-inspired ideas for your Community Read activities!

- Imagine a new Dog Man story and create a comic about it.
- Host a Dog Man Readers Theater with kids reading various character parts aloud from one of the books in the series.
- Invite kids to create Dog Man Supa Reviews that describe their favorite Dog Man books in words and drawings or in short videos.
- Stage a TV talk show with Sarah Hatoff interviewing the cast from any Dog Man book.
- Create posters promoting reading that feature favorite Dog Man characters.
 Look for How to Draw instructions in almost every Dog Man book!
- Hold a Dog Man Read-A-Thon where kids read Dog Man books for a specific hour each day of your community read program.
- Be a helper like Dog Man! Brainstorm a list of all the ways Dog Man helps those around him.
 - Invite a community leader (principal, librarian, town mayor, firefighter, etc.) to read from a Dog Man book at a special story hour.
 - Write a poem or song about Dog Man or a favorite character from the series.
 - Craft shoebox dioramas depicting key scenes from Dog Man adventures.
