

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
These three erasers need a face and a body!


Make them look... 1. Happy 2. Goofy 3. Mad Now add... Arms, Hands, Legs, and Shoes

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Perfect Scratch Art

Follow these steps to help your child create their own scratch art masterpiece!

Materials:

- Sturdy white art paper or cardstock
- Oil pastels or crayons
- Black tempera paint
- Small paintbrush or foam brush
- Toothpick, plastic fork, chopstick, or other tool that works as a stylus

Instructions:

Step 1: Protect your surface by covering your work area with newspaper.

Step 2: Using oil pastels or crayons, let your child color in the entire sheet of paper in as many colors as possible—the more colors the better.

Step 3: With a paintbrush or foam brush, help your child to completely paint over the colored-in paper until the entire sheet is black. (This may require two coats.)

Step 4: After the paint has dried thoroughly, have your child use a toothpick or other stylus to scratch shapes or words to reveal their colorful scratch art!
