



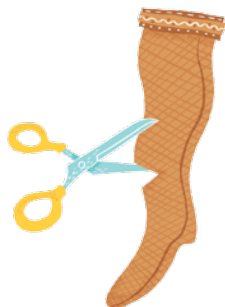
Grassheads

You Need



- Grass seed
- Old nylon stocking
- Organic potting soil or peat moss
- Saucer or shallow bowl
- Scissors
- Small rubber bands
- Waterproof paint, googly eyes, and decorations
- Glue

Start this fellow upside down and then flip him over so he can grow a head of grass hair.

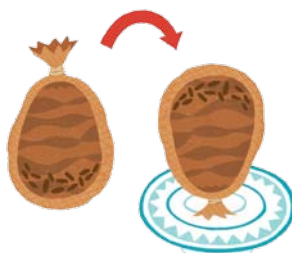


1. Cut 6–8 inches (15–20 cm) from the foot of an old nylon stocking.

Know-It-All

Water from the bottom up: If you keep your grasshead in a shallow bowl with an inch (2.5 cm) of water, the soil will keep moist enough so that you don't need to water your grasshead.

2. Pour about 2 tablespoons (30 ml) of grass seed into the toe and fill with potting soil.

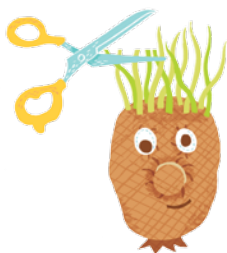


3. Wrap a rubber band around the opening and turn the head over so that the seeds are now on top. Place your grasshead on a saucer:

4. Form a nose or ears by holding the stocking and pulling a little of the soil away from the head. Tie off with a small rubber band. Use waterproof paint and googly eyes to give your grasshead a face. Wait for it to dry thoroughly.



5. Set your grasshead in a sunny spot and give it a light shower to keep the soil moist. The seeds will sprout in about 5 days.



6. In a little over a week, the grass will be tall enough to give your grasshead its very own hairstyle. Make sure to keep the soil moist and his hair will keep on growing.
