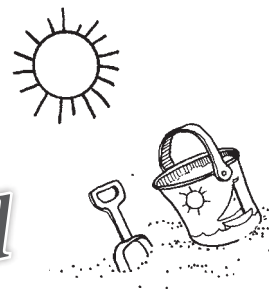

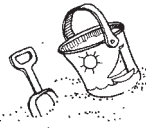

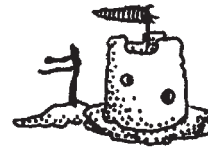
The Perfect Getaway!

Some beaches hold sand castle contests. Draw a sand castle that you think could win a contest. Then write why it would win.

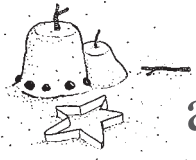

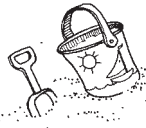
Under Starry Skies

What do you think about when you look at the stars? Do you make wishes? See pictures in the sky? Imagine going to space? Express your thoughts!





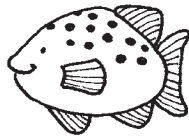

We All Scream for Ice Cream!

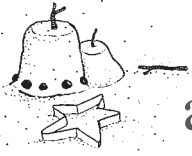
Invent a new flavor of ice cream. Then design an ad that will make people want to try it. Include words and pictures.



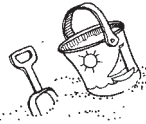

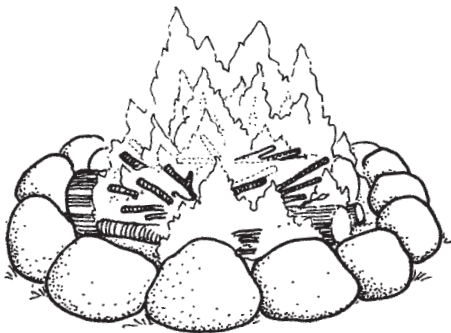
A Wild Ride
