

Center Slips

Center One

Write a journal entry for the day that you become king or queen of England. What will be the first thing you do as the monarch? What laws would you change or add in your country? Who would be rewarded? Who would be punished? Be sure to organize your thoughts into a well-written page.

Center Two

Complete the handout entitled “Character Perspectives, Events, and Support.” Be sure to fill in all required information.

Center Three

Design your own “Seal of Approval.” This would be the stamp of sorts you would use to sign laws into order when you became king or queen. Remember to decorate your personal reflection, and include a slogan on your seal. Your slogan should be one of your life goals or other important thought that guides your decision-making.

Center Four

Write a letter from one character to another. Choose a conflict to describe in detail or an important relationship to expose. Your letter should be at least a page long. As you express your thoughts and feelings as a character to another character, organize your thoughts so that your reader will understand you.

Center Five

Complete the “New Ending Form.” Write your ideas as clearly as possible.

*Note: These center slips have space in-between them so that you can easily print out the directions, cut the slips into three pieces, and place your instructions at your center for your students to follow. Sometimes I reinforce the paper by pasting it on construction paper. This adds a touch of color to your center too!
