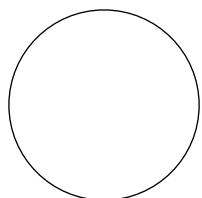


# Make a Moon Calendar

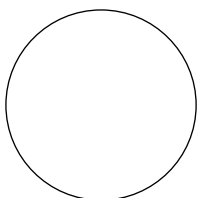
Track the moon's movements from your backyard as it moves around your world.

Look at the moon together each night, and have your child fill in the shape they see.

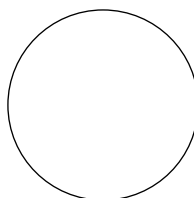
