Day 3: Napkin Adventures


It seems like such a simple thing — use the cloth /paper square to stay clean. But since cleanliness and kids rarely mix, use our two-step review.



Where Does It Go?

On the lap! It catches spills, is handy for wiping, and keeps unappetizing messiness hidden.

TRAIN THEM: Repetition is key. It's like putting on a seatbelt when he gets in the car: The napkin should be the first thing he reaches for at the table.





How Do You Use It?

Instead of letting her rub the whole thing across her face, show her how to wipe the corners of her mouth. **HOW TO TRAIN THEM:** When you see them going for their sleeve (or worse, arm!) just say 'napkin' — your kids will know what to do without things getting negative.
