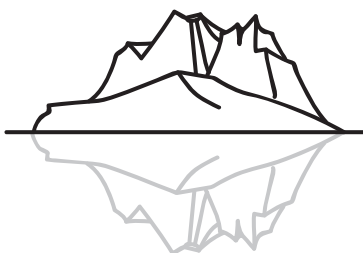
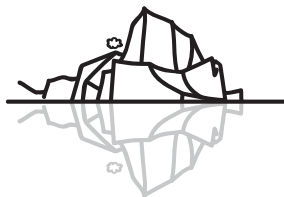
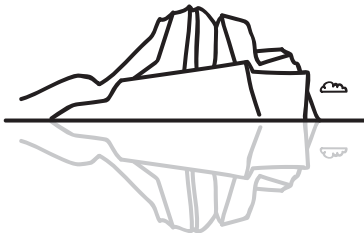
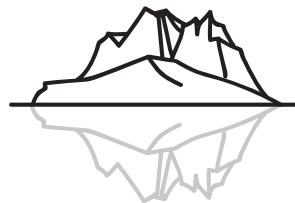
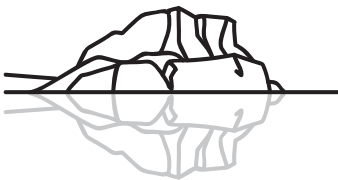
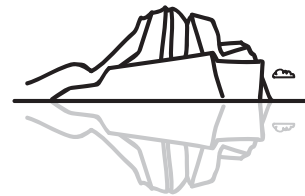
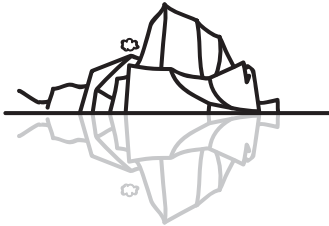
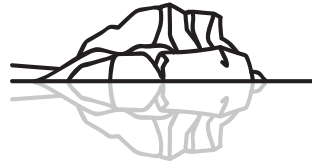
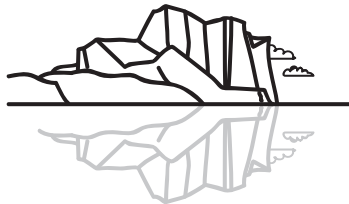
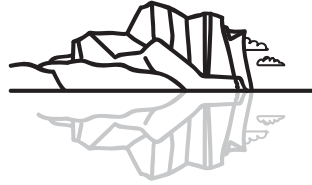
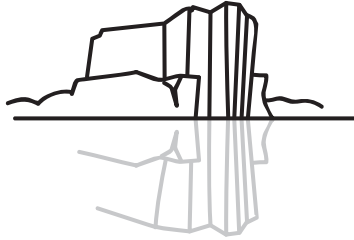




## Ice, Ice, Maybe?

## The Cold, Hard Facts!

- A glacier is a large mass of snow and ice that moves. Glaciers are usually at least 25 acres. Pretty huge!
- There were about 150 glaciers when Glacier National Park was established in 1910. By 2010 there were only 25 glaciers. How many glaciers have disappeared in those 100 years?

$$150 - ? = 25$$

- Scientists predict that by 2030 there will be no more glaciers in Glacier National Park. How old will you be in the year 2030?
- Glaciers disappear when summer melting outpaces snow and ice accumulation in the winter.
