☐ WOVEN BASKETS

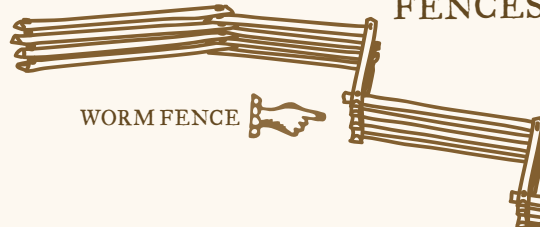
☐ HELLING STICKS,
