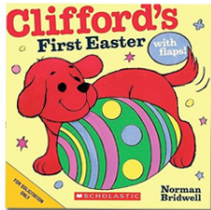

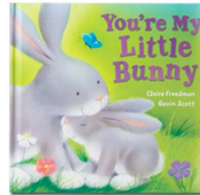

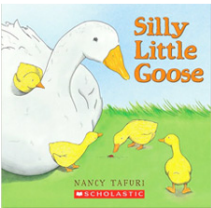

Claire Freedman

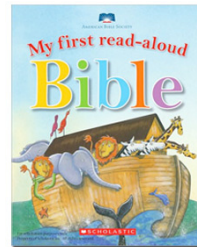

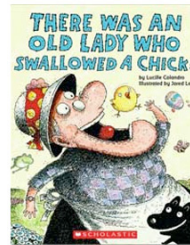
Bunny Race: Scholastic Reader Level 1

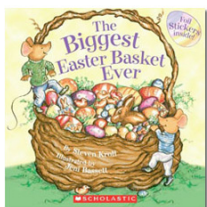
Small Child's Book Of Prayers

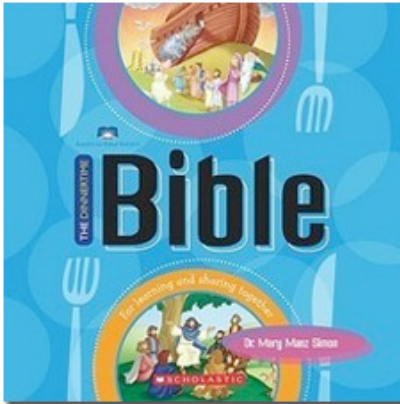
Pet Fairies: Bella the Bunny Fairy

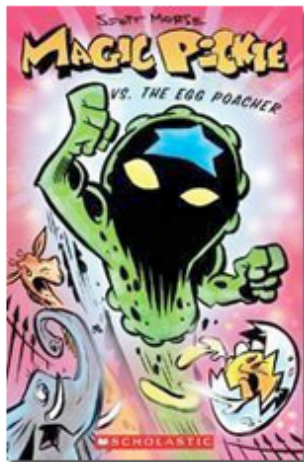
